#### **GATE CLUSTER CLASSES:**

What that means to us is that Matsuvama students identified as meeting the criteria to be classified as a Gifted and Talented Learner will be able to stay at Matsuyama and receive Gifted and Talented Education (GATE) services during the day. All teachers at Matsuyama have completed the GATE certification and are each fully qualified to teach the GATE classes. Each grade level will have one GATE cluster class which will be made up of GATE students and some students working at the Basic and high

below basic levels. The other two classes will be made up of Advanced and Proficient students that are not GATE identified as well as students performing at the Basic and Far Below Basic levels. Classes will still be heterogeneous in nature allowing all teachers to have strong models. Studies show that struggling students tend to achieve at a higher level when they are in classes with stronger learners. As you can see, teachers will need to be very strategic in making class placements and there will be very little room for parent requests. With the GATE Cluster program we will be instituting a GATE advisory committee next year and GATE teachers will be participating in ongoing coaching support and planning time, and fully implementing the William and Mary strategies. The GATE teacher positions will rotate from year to year which will allow all teachers to develop their capacity in teaching all levels of learners and to create a school where the "line forms at every door".

### **COMMON CORE**

Teachers will be diving deeper into the Math common core and beginning to implement more Language Arts common core activities. Many of our intermediate teachers are already incorporating more novel studies into the curriculum and you can expect to see more of that happening as well as more opportunities for opinion and informational writing as well as listening and speaking skills. The basic goal of the Language Arts common core is a much deeper level of comprehension and the ability to debate, discuss, and defend their ideas with evidence from the text. You may see less math homework in the intermediate levels; however, homework problems will be more multistep problems that may involve the use of a variety of math skills in order to solve. Primary students will also have more critical thinking problems while still learning their basic math facts. I will be conducting workshops throughout the year so parents can "experience" the common core!

#### HAVE A GREAT SUMMER

I wish each of you a very safe, relaxing, and fun-filled summer break. To our promoting 6<sup>th</sup> grade students and families I wish you the best of everything as you move into secondary school. I appreciate the year I was able to spend with you and I hope you keep in touch as the years go on. You are an incredible group of students! If you move over the summer, please be sure to notify the school of any changes. You can leave a message on the answering machine as I will be here most of the summer. I cannot thank you enough for the warm welcome and support you extended to me this year. My first year at Matsuyama was a great experience and I fully intend on returning in the fall!
