Welcome to the 2014-2015 school year! This year brings many new opportunities and challenges, including full implementation of the common core standards, a new math adoption, CAASPP testing that should result in student outcomes based on the common core standards, possible new benchmark assessments to support planning and instruction, a new report card, a new student information system (Infinite Campus), a district wide focus on Social Emotional Learning (SEL), and a new superintendent, Mr. Jose Banda.

Mr. Banda's vision for SCUSD is: Together create a service-oriented culture of excellence with success for all students and relationships that reflect our core values. The identified core values are: Achievement by all; Collaboration; Relationships; Integrity (transparency); Creativity/innovation; Service; Compassion; Personal and professional development.

While these may at first appear to be lofty goals they are achievable and will result in improved outcomes for all children as long as we all continue to work together, support each other, and keep our students at the forefront of all our decisions and actions.

For our students to be successful in school and in life it is important that they all learn to develop social emotional learning competences. These competencies include: self-awareness, social awareness, self-management, relationship skills, and responsible decision making. With these big changes it is important that we focus on the journey, the process of learning, and not just the destination (report cards and/or standardized testing scores). The common core standards in math focus on conceptual understanding, and not just learning the algorithms. Students and teachers are being asked to stretch their thinking and step out of their comfort zones. Much of the learning in English will take place in the classroom through class discussions, response journals, and writing prompts. The measurement for success is the journey, the individual growth each student experiences throughout the year, and the confidence they gain from the learning opportunities teachers will be providing our students.

Matsuyama has a rich tradition of a strong parent, teacher partnership, it is that continued support that will insure all our children experience great academic, social, and emotional growth throughout this transformational year.

Because of Matsuyama Parent support, the PTA could do such things as help fund the crossing guard's salary, we allocated \$15,000 to our classrooms, spent an additional \$10,000 for books for our classroom and to improve our library and provide three free books to every student. We also raised money for a climbing wall that we hope to install soon.

The PTA creates great memories and fun activities for the kids by sponsoring events like the harvest and cherry blossom festivals, the family dance and talent show. To foster communication and school spirit the Matsuyama PTA produces things like this newsletter. We create our yearbook & provide school's spiritwear, both close to cost. The PTA Reflections art contest gives students an opportunity to use their creative talents by expressing themselves through their own original works. We support several afterschool programs like the band and robotics.

We have also brought several assemblies to the school. This October we are proud to sponsor the Crocker Art Ark, a mobile art museum and education center that brings original works of art and activities to Matsuyama. To pull off such an experience will

require volunteers to help to be docents and help to with tours.

You can support Matsuyama without opening your wallets. By joining Bel Air's Something Extra Program a percentage of your purchases can go to our school.
